Canadians comprise an increasingly rich and diverse multicultural mosaic. In some parts of Canada, well over half of the population is representative of visible minorities.

Together, we are Canadian.

A person's race, ethnicity, beliefs, or background should never lead to discrimination. A worker's difference from co-workers is no reason for treatment without dignity and respect.

Labour rights are human rights.

We all face human rights issues and acts of discrimination – sometimes on a daily basis. Only by taking action can we hope to affect change.

Don't be afraid to object to discriminatory harassing remarks and actions when they occur. Let the offender know such behaviour is inappropriate, perhaps even illegal. Keep your local union representatives aware of any incidents, and ensure that procedures under the collective agreement are followed.



- By negotiating human rights protections and procedures in all UFCW Canada collective agreements.
